Supporting young people on the edge

Fancy doing a sponsored ride *without* ever actually getting on a bike? We recognise that many people want to do something for FYT but for a variety of reasons can't. Maz Dean and Rob Wardle, two youth workers are cycling from Manchester to the Greenbelt festival in Cheltenham on the August Bank Holiday (over 100 miles) and in the best Christian tradition will take the pain in your place. All you have to do is collect the sponsors locally as if you were the one cycling (see overleaf).

FYT have a strong history of working with young people on the edge, and working to include them in the church and kingdom. As such we wanted to do an event that everyone could be involved in, regardless of age or ability.

Edmund Tustian who was born with Cerebral Palsy and ran the FYT road show, Does He Take Communion? Around the issues of disability, exclusion, inclusion and the kingdom of God, explained, "***finding ways to include everyone, demands fresh ideas, and although wacky the idea of a virtual bike ride means everyone can join in to support this great charity and good luck to Maz and Rob***"

Pam Passmore (aged 76) says, "***I am happy to collect sponsors this way, I haven't ridden a bike for years but I am looking forward to seeing the expression on my friends faces when I tell them I am about ride virtually over a hundred miles in aid of charity***"
