






Informal Education

Youth work process










- Where are you, are you calling/inviting yp to that place?
- What things that may seem beautiful or good could hinder you from going to a new place?
- What does going WITH them mean?
 In working with young people do not try to call back to where they were and do not call them to where you are as beautiful a place as that may seem to you. You must have the courage to go with them to a place that neither you nor they have ever been before.





Frontier Youth Trust MISSION WITH YOUNG PEOPLE AT RISK

Formal – Control over Physical and Social environment. Set Syllabus Time frames
Non Formal – As above but Curriculum notions rather than set and looser time frames.
Informal – Little or no control, conversation or experience orientated, value informed rather than curriculum based.

Frontier

- Characteristics of informal education
- -Incidental or unplanned
- -Purposeful and deliberate.
- -Conversation is core which be steered or directed.
- -It is not time structured.
- -It is not about making a point.
- -The learners are voluntary participants and so control is minimal.
- -To be effective it must involve dialogue based on mutual respect and two-way communication.
- -It is experiential and involves direct participation in the events of life.
- -It works alongside existing social, economic, and political situations.

DEFINITION OF DETACHED WORK

Frontier Youth Trust

The process of building mutual relationships with young people on the streets, in the park, or other areas of the community where young people are, in their free time. This process offers a distinct context where relationships are free from traditional notions of adult power, offering a unique environment and opportunity to engage in long term holistic youth work underpinned by the values of informal education, empowerment, participation, equal opportunities and a theology characterised by humility and orthopraxis.



Detached OR semi detached work – Ho it differs?

- More equal power levels.
- Variety of settings
- Solely based on relationship
- Control is minimal



Aims Of Detached Work


- -To make relationships with young people who have few positive relationships and avenues for support and help them realise their full potential.
- -To help bridge gaps in understanding between the local community and young people.
- -To identify the needs and interests of young people and develop appropriate strategies for action either by the detached team or with other agencies.
- -To enable young people to take more control over their lives.





(M) = Mechanism


- 1-3 Introductions, Awareness, Interest, Graffiti, Presence.
- 3-4 Twists, Local knowledge, Conversation, Information.
- 4-5 Inclusion in football, Street Basketball, Targeted times.
- 5-6 Day Trips, Activities, Conversation, Open Self.
- 6-7 Residentials, Open House, Food.
- 7-8 Sunrise watch, Come and Help, Greenbelt.
- 8-9 Militancy, Culture Jamming, Local/Global Issues, Fast Game, Road, Stained Glass.








Detached groups 1st Jan





Detached groups 1st June


