What is StreetSpace all about?

StreetSpace is a Frontier Youth Trust project that works with young people on the street and in the community.

Our aim is to promote young people's personal, social and spiritual development in line with the core youth work principles of: empowerment, education, participation and equality of opportunity.

StreetSpace will contact young people where they are and work to the following framework:

1. **OBSERVATION** - Working out which geographical areas and young people to engage.
2. and 3. **COLD CONTACT** - Initial introductions with young people are made.
4. **AREA BASED WORK** - Touching base with all the groups in the patch.
5. **PEER GROUP WORK** - Work centres on groups with a common shared interest, e.g. football, skating or hanging out.
6. **BASIC SMALL GROUP WORK** - Made up from core members of the larger group
7. **RISKY SMALL GROUP WORK** - Not about putting workers or the young people at risk, but risking relationships built by challenging the young people.
8. **EXPOSURE & EXPLORATION OF SPIRITUALITY** - Working with the young people to enable them to explore the bigger questions of life and their place in the world.
9. **PEER EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT or CHURCH ON THE EDGE** - Enabling young people to become active participants in their community, or explore their faith journey.



What do we do?

Streetspace operates as a values driven community of practice. We support local projects around detached work and community involvement with young people.

Through our StreetSpace Hub we are able to help local projects in a variety of ways. Some projects opt to become licensed local expressions of StreetSpace, others simply want support or training.

Local expressions usually undertake

- Detached youth work
- Community consultation with young people through M and M's (meals and meetings)
- Hear my Voice (a new initiative supporting the M and M's processes)
- Spin Off projects (depending on other local needs and interests of young people)

We help with: getting the project underway, policies and procedures, training, recording processes, coaching and much more.

We share our knowledge of working with young people in order to help develop a fresh approach to challenging young people's behaviour through good youth work processes.

We do this with the critical intention of growing relevant expressions of church with marginalized young people that are locally grounded and resource light.



Joining StreetSpace?

As a licensed local expression of StreetSpace you will have access to:

- Induction training and then one training event per year
- A start up pack which will include: comprehensive policies, procedures, publicity materials and templates
- StreetSpace branding, publicity and id cards
- The StreetSpace model of work, M&Ms and the processes associated with this
- FYT Alongside a coaching, supervision and consultancy service
- Support in evaluating progress and learning
- A helpline and impartial advice
- Advanced training once the project has been established
- Frontier Youth Trust News
- Frontier Camps (summer camps dedicated to working with young people at risk).
- A unique StreetSpace email address
- StreetSpace's web site.
